Basic Conditions Statement In respect of the Uttoxeter Neighbourhood Plan: July 2016

This Basic Conditions Statement has been prepared in support of the Uttoxeter Neighbourhood Development Plan (UNP) and demonstrates how the Plan meets the statutory requirements set out within the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended by the Localism Act 2011) and the Neighbourhood Planning Regulations 2012. The regulations require that a Neighbourhood Plan deals with planning matters (i.e. the use and development of land), is submitted by a qualifying body, covers a stated Plan Period and identifies a designated Neighbourhood Area.

The core basic conditions for Neighbourhood Plans, as required by Paragraph 8 of Schedule 4B to the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended), are as follows:

- Having regard to national policies and advice contained in the National Planning Practice Guidance.
- The making of the neighbourhood plan contributes to the achievement of sustainable development.
- The making of the neighbourhood plan is in general conformity with the strategic policies contained in the development plan for the area of the authority (or any part of that area).
- The making of the neighbourhood plan does not breach, and is otherwise compatible with, EU obligations.

The Neighbourhood Area relates only to the Town of Uttoxeter and does not include in whole or part any other Neighbourhood Area. The UNP is in conformity with the NPPF	In order to ensure that the UNP conforms to the NPPF, an Assessment of Compliance has been undertaken. The table in Appendix 2 demonstrates how the final proposed policies all link back into the core aims of the NPPF, thus fully supporting the strategy established at the national level. As previously noted this document does not consider minerals and waste planning and as such there can be no contribution made by any policies to this topic. Paragraph 7 of the NPPF sets out sustainable development as consisting of the following factors: To contribute to building a strong, responsive and competitive economy, To support strong, vibrant and healthy communities; and To contribute to protecting and enhancing the natural, built and historic environment. As demonstrated in the Assessment of Compliance table, the UNP is compliant with the relevant NPPF which has an overarching aim of promoting sustainable development in terms of economic, social and environmental issues (see paragraph 7 of the NPPF). 	Environmental Impact: It is stated in the UNP that the Plan simply reflects and reports the strategic development sites (allocations) set out in the East Staffordshire Borough Council Local Plan in the plan area and it's Neighbourhood Area. As such, the UNP does not allocate any sites itself. Policies regarding housing mix and development standards (including those on affordable housing) in the UNP state that schemes are designed to be in accordance with the relative policies in the Local Plan, which in itself is in conformity with EU regulations on Environmental Impacts.	
	Human rights: The plan has been positively prepared to ensure none of the policies infringe on any human rights from the Human Rights Act 1998.	


