

East Staffordshire Borough Council Service User Equality Data 2017-2018

The Brewhouse Arts Centre

In the period from April 2017 to March 2018 equality information was provided by 957 people who attended workshops and participatory events at the Brewhouse Arts Centre. Around 33% of the visitors were men and the remaining 67% were women which is a greater proportion than their representation in the borough (women account for 50.4% of the borough's population).

Nine out of ten people attending participatory events and workshops stated that their ethnicity was White: British, 6% of the people stated that they were from Black, Asian or Minority Ethnic backgrounds [data from 941 people].

Around 13% of the Brewhouse visitors stated that they had a disability (almost double the proportion reported in 2017), which is a lower proportion than the 17.7% of all borough residents who stated that their day-to-day activities are limited, but greater than the proportion of people aged 15 and under in the borough who state that they have a long-term health problem or disability (0.7%).

The majority of people attending workshops and participatory events were aged under 15 (35%). This proportion is higher than the borough's population aged under 15 (13%). Those aged 16 to 24 represented around 22% which is also higher than 10.9% of the borough's citizens of that age. The people aged 25 to 39 years formed 14% of the Brewhouse Arts Centre attendees and around 6% were aged between 40 and 59. People aged between 60 and 80 years comprised 21% of the visitors (this group represented only 3% in 2017), leaving 2% for those aged 81 to 90 years [data from 791 people].
