

Anti-social Behaviour Reports

The information within this report was gathered from people who made a complaint about anti-social behaviour (ASB) to East Staffordshire Borough Council.

Equality information is collected on the following protected characteristics: sex, ethnicity, disability and age. If the reported antisocial behaviour is committed against someone because of their disability, gender identity, race, religion or belief, or sexual orientation then this would be referred to Staffordshire Police.




Figure 1. Total number of anti-social behaviour complaints reported in every calendar year (from 2008 to 2017)

The data from 2017 indicates that anti-social behaviour reported to the Council is generally decreasing. It should be noted that due to the introduction of the Anti-social Behaviour Crime and Policing Act 2014, this allows further categories of anti-social behaviour to be considered by agencies.

The most common type of anti-social behaviour reported is neighbour disputes, such as rubbish issues.

The following chart contains equality information about the characteristics of people who have made anti-social behaviour complaints during 2017.




Figure 2. The protected characteristics of people who report anti-social behaviour

Out of the 74 anti-social behaviour complaints, 41 of them were reported by females and 23 of them were reported by males.

There is no specific equality data provided by the remaining 10 complaints, these would include the complaints reported by Staffordshire Police and businesses.
