B1 What is the Decision?	To approve and publish an amended statement of intent for ECO4 which includes a simplification of the Route descriptions and incorporates the 'Great British Insulation Scheme' (GBIS), as recommended by Ofgem.
B2 What are the reasons for the Decision?	Originally Ofgem provided a draft statement of intent (SOI) for ECO4 which ESBC used to set its eligibility criteria for ECO4 funding.
B2 Alternative options considered and rejected?	This was agreed upon by EDR and published on 21/12/2022 (V.4).
	Ofgem then amended the draft SOI to differentiate between property ownership types for eligibility.
	ESBC amended its SOI to reflect this, which was agreed upon by EDR and published on 22/6/2023 (V.4.1).
	Ofgen have now amended the SOI a third time to combine ECO4 and the Great British Insulation Scheme (GBIS), and improves the clarity of the statement, including simplification of the Route descriptions. The new template also corrects erroneous reference to BEIS, which is no longer the relevant government department.
	The attached SOI (V.4.2) includes all amendments as required by Ofgem and will enable residents to access ECO4 and GBIS funding.
B3 What are the contributions to Corporate Priorities?	Standing up for our communities through supporting Council policies for improving the homes of those in fuel poverty or vulnerable to the cold.
