B1 What is the Decision?	To award a capital grant of £14, 000 to Burton Canoe Club following the panel approval of an application to the Council's Ward Enhancement Programme, funded by the UK Shared Prosperity Fund.

B2 Alternative options considered and rejected?

The Ward Enhancement Programme (WEP) was approved by Cabinet in September 2023 and created a £1.5m funding programme, financed by the UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF), through which communities across the Borough could access capital funding to deliver projects in their local areas that improve prosperity, heritage or tourism.

The WEP operates on an application basis whereby local community groups and other organisations can apply for capital funding with their application being considered and reviewed by a Member panel comprised of 5 Councillors and chaired by the Cabinet Member for Regeneration and Development.

At the panel meeting on 14 December 2023, an application was approved for the delivery of a project titled: Burton Canoe Club landing decks which aims to do the following:

This is a nationally recognized canoe club which will attract visitors from all over the UK but particularly the Midlands. Members of the canoe club assisted in the *Transforming the Trent Valley Project* on Newton Road Park by helping to remove Himalayan Balsam from areas which were inaccessible from the river bank. They will also assist in the planting of a community orchard in the park.

Newton Road Park is itself a heritage site having been the site of an air show in 1910 which raised money to buy the Mayoresses chain. The Park received a Gold award for its entry into Heart of England in Bloom Open Spaces category and a section of the park received Outstanding for its entry in the *It's your Neighbourhood* category

The Project involves the replacement of two landing decks for the Club.

The two existing landing decks, following many temporary repairs are now at the end of their useful life and have become dangerous through rot.

A grant award of £14, 000 was approved for this project, subject to the taking of this Executive Decision by the Cabinet Member.
