To periodically suspend parking charges at three ESBC car parks (Uttoxeter Leisure Centre, Meadowside Leisure Centre and Trinity Road; Uttoxeter) to allow for testing of the COVID-19 virus until March 31 <sup>st</sup> 2021. The first tests are to commence at Uttoxeter Leisure Centre on Wednesday (3 <sup>rd</sup> Feb) and Friday (5 <sup>th</sup> Feb) (9am-1pm). The decision to suspend parking charges on the named car parks, in support of testing and vaccinations will be made by the Deputy Leader as and when requested by the relevant Public Health Authorities.
<b>B2</b> What are the reasons for the Decision?	The car parks and neighbouring facilities have been identified as potential suitable locations for the testing of individuals for the COVID-19 virus due to their location and space.

The main financial issues arising from this decision are as follows:

There is no clear schedule of dates required for each individual car park. Therefore indicative losses only can be provided at this time based on possible scenarios until the end of March 2021. Estimates have been calculated based on the current lockdown restrictions being maintained until the end of March 2021. For comparison figures from September have also been included when a less restrictive lock down was in place. These have been calculated excluding the leisure centre users and are shown for 4 weeks only.
