B1 What is the Decision?	To approve the recommendation shown in paragraph B2, and following a review of the applications for the Council's Additional Restrictions Grant scheme received as at July 2021.

B2 What are the reasons for the Decision?

The Government announced the Additional Restrictions Grant (ARG) scheme on 31 October 2020 to enable Local Authorities to provide support to businesses severely impacted by the national and local pandemic restrictions.

The Council's scheme was initially implemented in November 2020 and since then has undergone reviews in February 2021 and April 2021 with approved changes applied accordingly.

The current version of the Council's scheme has three elements, each with differing criteria as shown below:

Severe Impact (main element, in place since November 2020)

- For businesses with or without a business rates
 Rateable Value (RV) that are not mandated to close
 but who remain open and are severely impacted by
 the Govt restrictions in place.
- Applicants must demonstrate a reduction in turnover of at least 20% for the year ending 21 March 2021 when compared to the previous financial year ending 31 March 2020.
- Grant payments dependant on RV:
 - o No RV / RV<£15k £10,000
 - o RV £15k-£51k £15,000
 - o RV >£51k £20,000

New Businesses (new element brought in June 2021)

- For new businesses set up since 01/04/2019 that had a business plan accepted by their bank/financial institution for financial support.
- Grant payments dependant on RV:
 - o No RV £5,000
 - o RV £10,000

Supporting Other Businesses (new element with one application window from 1-15 June 2021)

- For businesses that can show they were trading on or before 01/04/2021.
- The business must not be entitled to a Restart Grant.
- The business must not already have received an Additional Restrictions Grant.
- One off grant payment £5,000

Grant payments to date

The table below shows the number and amount of successful applications for the Council's scheme. Should the Council have spent all of its ARG allocated funding (£3.4m) by 31

July 2021, a further top up funding can be accessed to provide further support to local businesses. As at 08/07/2021 the following grant payments have been made:

The Council has recently approved to fund part of the County Council's Business Support schemes the amount of £57,000 as well as extending the scope of existing ESBC business support schemes by £15,000 from the Additional Restrictions Grant fund. There are 14 applications outstanding where we have requested further information. It is evident that even with the £57k provided to Staffs CC and if all 14 outstanding applications were successful for at least a £10,000 grant under the 'Severe' Impact element, the Council's full allocation would still not be spent by 31 July.

Five options were put forward following the review:

- 1) Do nothing was not the preferred way forward as there was still a large amount of unspent funding, so it was agreed to discount this option.
- 2) It has been agreed that all applications currently declined under the 'Severe Impact' element will be reviewed. There are 107 applications rejected so far where the applicants have not provided sufficient information to meet all of the criteria under this element. However, from the information they have provided with their application it is likely they would meet the criteria under t-he 'Supporting Other Businesses' element.
- 3) It has been agreed that where the applications declined under the 'Severe Impact' element meet the criteria under the 'Supporting Other Business'

	element, those applications will be eligible for a grant under the 'Supporting Other Business' element. 4) It has been agreed to increase the level of grant under the 'Supporting Other Business' element to £10,000 per successful application.	
	5) It has been agreed to shut down the application form for 'Severe Impact', leaving the 'New Business' and 'Supporting Other Business' application forms open with immediate effect. This will make it simpler for businesses to apply for a grant and should ensure current funding is fully utilised.

Financial Implications

B5 What are the financial implications?

The main financial issues arising from this decision are as follows:

There is a finite amount of funding available to the Council for the ARG scheme: £3,458,861. Should the Council spend its allocation before 31 July 2021, the Govt will make further top-up funding available to the Council to support local businesses under the ARG scheme, subject to the Council being able to demonstrate that all existing funding, including any transferred to a third party has been defrayed in order to qualify for the top-up.

Under this latest review, a further £1,312,000 could be utilised from the current unspent allocated funding:

- Successful applications under the 'Supporting Other Businesses' element will be entitled to a grant of £10,000. Therefore, the 9 payments made so far will receive an extra £5,000 to bring their grant payments to the new level, spending £45,000.
- Should the 14 applications awaiting further information be successful, that will spend a further £140,000.
- Should the declined applications under the 'Severe Impact' element meet the criteria under the 'Supporting Other Businesses' element and be approved for payment, those successful applications will spend a further £1,070,000.
- The Council has recently approved using £72,000 from its ARG allocation to fund part of Staffordshire County Council's Supporting Businesses Fund.

This leads to a total potential spend of £3,359,633.05, leaving an unspent amount of £99,227.95 which could be managed from any new applications opened to the 'New Businesses' or 'Supporting Other Businesses' elements proposed for re-opening with immediate effect.
