B2 What are the reasons for the Decision?	<ul> <li>To apply to the 'Rough Sleeping Initiative Fund 2022 - 2025' for funding to:</li> <li>Continue to provide 3 x Emergency Bed Spaces for rough sleepers or people at risk of rough sleeping, plus additional flexible funds¹ to secure B&amp;B or other provision as required over and above the emergency bed spaces.</li> <li>Extend the Navigator Service until March 2025 to attend to individuals placed in temporary accommodation in relatively short order to provide assistance, and work with the Housing Options Team to determine what can be done to further their Personal Housing Plan.</li> <li>Extend the Housing First Intervention until March 2025, creating 2 new high intensity support social tenancies each year.</li> <li>If the application is successful in any service element, the entire amount required for that element of the proposal will be awarded. The RSI funding application is in 3 parts, attached at Appendices 1, 2 and 3.</li> <li>The measures detailed above are currently in operation, and have been shown to be effective with last 2 annual rough sleeper counts²</li> </ul>

# **Financial Implications**

<b>B5</b> What are the financial	
implications?	

The main financial issues arising from this decision are as follows:

- DLUHC has guaranteed funding for existing interventions from 1 April 2022 to 30 June 2022, this will automatically be paid to the Council in April 2022 according to the 20 December 2021 letter from Eddie Hughes, Minister for Rough Sleeping and Housing. The funding bid at Appendix 1, 2 & 3 therefore relates to the period from 1 July 2022 to 31 March 2025.
- If the DLUHC funding application is successful, the Council will make available the amount specified in the funding award for the provision of the services detailed in the application. In the event funding is not awarded there will be no direct cost to the council as the existing contracts will naturally cease. There will be a resulting increase in expenditure as rough sleepers able to access existing council services will do so.
- The bid has been prepared based on the estimates provided by the existing suppliers about costs and demand for service.
- The first half of the money will be paid on receipt of the signed agreement, the second half dependent on the project meeting the objectives i.e. payment by results.
- The service agreement will state that the service provider will only receive payment when the funding is received from the DLUHC.
- The revenue, if received, will be provided by the MHCLG pursuant to sections 31(3) and 31(4) of the Local Government Act 2003.

# **B8.1** Positive (Opportunities/Benefits):

- Through engagement with residents of the Housing First and recipients of the Emergency Bed Spaces it is anticipated that the service will assist reintegration for those that have become excluded, although this is likely to be a lengthy process in most cases.
- The Navigator service will proactively engage with rough sleepers who
  require more time and specialist intervention than is currently available via
  the existing Rough Sleeper Outreach Service.
- Cold Weather Provision through 'surge' funding is vital to prevent harmful exposure to the elements, and facilitates contact between marginalised individuals and relevant services.
- A multiyear funding commitment offers service design and procurement opportunities.

- The 25% cut in Q1 in 2022/23, as well as the cost breakdowns required by the application process, suggest that the funding offered may be a reduction on previous years.
