B1 What is the Decision?	To financially contribute towards the cost of new street furniture at Burton Train Station as part of Staffordshire County Council's forecourt works
<b>B2</b> What are the reasons for the Decision?	Staffordshire County Council are undertaking regeneration works affecting the forecourt at Burton Train Station.
	As part of this project and the wider town regeneration programme, East Staffordshire Borough Council has requested that a greater number of planters are installed at the station, totalling 10. Additionally, the Council has requested that a new finger post is installed highlighting points of interest in the town. The new street furniture is to match the style of those proposed elsewhere in the town, in accordance with the Public Realm Improvement Plan.
	Staffordshire County Council had allocated £3,500 towards street furniture for this project, however the total now comes to £17,927.47.
	It is proposed that East Staffordshire Borough Council contributes the additional funding of £14,427.47 in order to facilitate the greater regeneration of the station forecourt. It is also proposed to fund this as 50% from the 2019/20 Open Spaces revenue budget and 50% from Growth Point Reserves.
