<b>B1</b> What is the Decision?	For the Council to provide dog bag dispensers around the borough.
<b>B2</b> What are the reasons for the Decision?	As a Corporate Plan target a decision was made to provide dog bag stations around the borough to encourage dog walkers to pick up after their dog has fouled.
	These dog bag stations will be strategically placed on Borough Council land, picking out 'hot-spot' locations such as park entrances and areas where dog walkers pass through. The stations will not be placed on Parish Council land following feedback from Parish Councils that they would not be able to support the replenishing of the stations with dog waste bags.  This will also aid CCE Officers when they are performing dog bag checks
