B1 What is the Decision?	To launch the Community Regeneration Fund (CRF) by 30 th June 2022. The aim of the fund is provide grants of between £1,000 and £16,000 for up to 80% of a total project cost. Projects should benefit the local community and make a physical improvement to a community space/amenity. The focus is on improving the public realm rather than repairing and maintaining existing assets. The fund will run for a period of 12 months. Applications to this fund will be dealt with in three stages: Expression of interest; Panel presentation; and Final submission. No grant of any level is guaranteed until the application has had their final application approved and submitted all required supporting information. All applications at each stage will be considered by a cross-party panel consisting of 5 members and chaired by the Deputy Leader for Communities & Housing Standards. The panel will meet monthly, starting end of July – date tbc - and will be supported by the Social Regeneration Officer. Guidance for the fund has been prepared and there will be additional monitoring of the grant award once the grant payment has been made. Support with the process will be available for applicants from Officers.
B2 What are the reasons for the Decision?	The launch of the Community Regeneration Fund will help to support the ongoing regeneration of East Staffordshire by supporting local groups and organisations to deliver capital projects which will help to enhance local areas
