<b>B1</b> What is the Decision?	To submit an application to the second round of the Levelling Up Fund.
<b>B2</b> What are the reasons for the Decision?	On 23 <sup>rd</sup> March 2022, the Government launched the Levelling Up Fund Round 2 (LUF2) prospectus, which detailed the process for bidding for up to £20m of grant funding for regeneration initiatives.
	Originally planned to close on 6 <sup>th</sup> July, the fund is open until 2 <sup>nd</sup> August, giving around 4 months for the development of a funding application.
	During April, the Elected Members of the Council were consulted on LUF2, inviting all to submit ideas for projects. In May, these ideas were publically consulted upon, with the funding bid being developed over June and July.
	A summary of the bid can be found at Appendix 1, with the Council bidding for £20m towards the delivery of three projects:
	<ul> <li>Revitalising the Market Quarter</li> <li>Creating a new, multi-activity indoor leisure facility</li> <li>Investing in Bass House</li> </ul>
	If successful, the conditions of the funding award will be taken to a meeting of Full Council, along with any ask of financial contribution, for the consideration of Members.
	The Leader of the Opposition has also signed a letter in support of this submission.

# **B5** What are the financial implications?

The decision is to apply for funding which is subject to Government approval and then if successful for approval by full Council. The main financial issues arising from this decision will be considered within the future Council report if the bid is successful. These are listed as follows:

The total cost estimate for the proposed projects equals £22,399,973, with a maximum of £20m available from the Levelling Up Fund.

As a criterion of the fund, Councils are encouraged to provide a match contribution of at least 10% to their applications.

As such, the application is made on the basis of up to £2,399,973 being conditionally provided by the Council, proportionately split between the three projects.

If the funding application was successful, fully or partly, any contribution from the Council would need to be considered by Full Council later in the year. At this stage the degree to which this proposal may have ongoing revenue budget implications, such as future running costs or subsidy requirements has not been ascertained and these alongside any potential VAT implications will be outlined within the business case report to Council. The business case would also include the implications and risks associated with additional revenue requirements that could be incurred as a result of the capital expenditure / funding and therefore any potential increase in the base revenue budget.
