B2 What are the reasons for the Decision?

The Leisure Services contract includes a number of outlying pitches, owned by the authority and managed by the contractor. A number of the changing rooms located at these sites are in need of refurbishment to ensure they are suitable for users due to a number of damaged or worn areas over time (including roof leaks and unusable shower areas).

The improvement plan agreed with the contractor in July 2022 provides a number of enhancements to the facilities which will enable them to provide suitable changing accommodation and meet the requirements of the leagues and organisations using them.

Everyone Active will co-ordinate and manage the works with their contractor.

The Leisure Services contract provides details of responsibility for the repair or enhancement of specific areas of buildings that relate to either the contractor or the authority. The agreed improvement plan sets out the costs for both parties against these areas as follows:
