	i) Increase hourly hall hire fee from £50 per hour to £60 per hour
	ii) increase monthly rent on food market traders based on Station Street from £199.93 per month to £220.00 per month
	iii) Increase the daily charge for promotional hire space on Station Street from £50 a day to £60 a day.
B2 What are the reasons for the Decision?	i) The Market Hall has now established itself as a venue that can be hired exclusively for events. The £10 price increase will realign itself with other Council venues, yet still remain a very competitively priced events venue in the Borough.
	ii) Traders based on Station Street have not had an increase in rent for several years. In recognition of this an increase is recommended this year to realign rents with current market rates.
	iii) Promotional trading space on Station Street is high in demand. Benchmarking was completed against other promotional space in the Town and it was found that Station Street was priced lower than other locations operated by the shopping centres. A price increase would mean the fees remained very competitively priced but more in line with Market rates.
