The extension of the eligibility criteria for the scheme will mean that more households who are deemed vulnerable to cold will be eligible for help.

The guideline for the Flexible Criteria identifies people with the following health conditions as being particularly vulnerable to cold:

- people with cardiovascular conditions
- people with respiratory conditions (in particular, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease and childhood asthma)
- people with mental health conditions
- people with disabilities

Those identified as at risk will be allowed to have a higher income threshold and still be eligible for the scheme.
