B1 What is the Decision?	To adopt the East Staffordshire Tree Planting Guidance
B2 What are the reasons for the Decision?	A toolkit guide for designing, planting and management of public realm trees has been commissioned by Staffordshire County Council. The toolkit is aimed at developers and public bodies. The toolkit has been prepared as a direct response to the 'I-Tree Survey' carried out in 2016/2017. This document is currently in draft, due to be finalised by the end of July. The timescale for the document has been delayed from the original timescale, which was the end of March. The toolkit provides a concise source of guidance which doesn't currently exist at a County or Borough level, however given common issues experienced through the planning application process, there is now also an opportunity to incorporate additional information, which would make it more specific to the Borough. Therefore an East Staffordshire Tree Planting Guidance has also been prepared, taking many elements of the Staffordshire Toolkit along with including additional tree information relevant for local planning authorities.
