LEPs all over the country have been in a state of flux for some time now due to Brexit and differing government ministers changing ministries and it is still unclear what the future of LEPs will be.</p>
--

There are few capital programmes being granted from government and LEPs have simply been continuing to work on existing capital programmes.

GBS LEP has also gone through a significant change of governance and legal status following the completion of the LEP review and is now a company limited by guarantee with two thirds of the board coming from the private sector and one third being public sector. This has meant the four southern districts have had to rotate round as only three of the four will be able to attend. The rotation will be yearly in alphabetical order with Lichfield taking the first year 20-21 out and Tamworth taking 21-22 out. ESBC's year out will be in 23-24.

Many of the larger current capital programmes are underway in Birmingham City and will limited impact on ES. However, there are many smaller programmes which are aimed at business support which do benefit business in ES.
