The committee work programmes cover many areas including the LEP Delivery Plan, Enterprise Zones, Exiting Europe, Covid Recovery, Advanced Manufacturing, Low Carbon Technologies, Fin Tech and the Commonwealth Games.

Members have focussed on Skills and Young People as these need to be developed in order to regenerate the economy of the area.

In addition, as Chair I have sought to keep members informed by introducing an induction programme for new elected members and by arranging visits to key developments e.g. Central Birmingham and the Commonwealth Games.

Value for money-The Joint Scrutiny Committee monitors the LEP Strategic Economic Plan so ensures that the contributions ESBC makes are providing value for money for our taxpayers. For example, I constantly ask how employment and high skills opportunities are being made accessible to young people who live outside the large conurbations.

**Community regeneration**-ESBC (Uttoxeter) has benefitted from the LEP Towns and Local Centres Framework. Members were presented with the evaluation of the work and had opportunities to ask questions.

Members received an update on the Local Growth Fund Programme and I was pleased to note that Burton Regeneration & Flood Defence had been added to the Programme.

**Environment & Health and Wellbeing-** Members received a report on the Annual Delivery Plan which includes deliverables on Life Sciences (Health), Energy Technologies (Low Carbon) and a case study of the £37,000 LEP contribution to the production of the Burton Station Street Regeneration Plan. I was able to ask questions about new developments to benefit local residents in the short and medium term.
