That when women fulfil their potential all of us in society benefit. That equality results in better politics, a more vibrant economy and a workforce that utilises the talents of the whole population.</p> <p>This Council resolves: To continue to call for gender equality in respect of: Equal representation in politics and business; Equal representation in education; Equal pay; Equal treatment of women by and in the media; Equal parenting rights; And calls for an end to the exploitation of and violence against women.”</p>
