Therefore there are a relatively small number of changes, but the changes are necessary to take account of legislative and other changes. In most cases the impact of the changes are negligible or nil.

The largest single change is to bedroom entitlement, which previously offered greater choice but that choice has now been restricted to the housing benefit criteria. It is believed this change is proportionate in response to affordability concerns.

The Allocations Policy is operated under a partnership agreement with Trent & Dove, as a result consultation with Trent and Dove on allocation principles has been ongoing for several months.

- National Probation Service & SWM Community Rehabilitation Company
