1. <u>Purpose of the Report</u>

1.1 For the Council to approve the number and allocation of Councillors to serve on Committees, to receive nominations to those committees from the political groups and to appoint those committees.

2. <u>Background</u>

- 2.1. The Council is required to review the appointment of seats on committees from time to time.
- 2.2. Following the Crown Ward By-Election, this report provides an update on the ramifications for the Membership of the Committees and Sub Committees of the Council.
- 2.3. As a result of the Conservatives winning the Crown By-Election, the political make-up of the council (for the three groups) is as follows:

2.4. When allocating committee seats to the political groups of the Council, there are two rules which must be satisfied. Firstly, the overall allocation of seats must reflect the political balance of the Council. Secondly, each committee must reflect the political balance of the Council.

2.5. There are 99 committee seats, meaning that the total potential entitlement across the committees as a whole is as follows:

2.6. As can be seen from the table above, there are 98 seats allocated to the three political groups. If the 99th seat were to be offered to either group this create an imbalance. Therefore one of the Committees will run with a vacancy.
