Re-coppice tree group in this area, remove self seeded vegetation along the ramp to open view into the washlands from Burton Bridge

Mown footpath connects to the boardwalk and leads users to a riverside platform / canoe / boat launch

Additional footpath extends vista created by Bargates housing development and connects users to the washlands

River bank reprofiling

Scattered native tree planting along the primary footpath creates narrow glimpses into the washlands, additional tree planting to gap up the adjacent tree group increases feeling of enclosure within the greenspace

Maintenance access over swale

Several unused groundwater extraction and inspection chambers owned by Molston Coors to remain accessible.

Public realm and access improvements along Meadows Drive following offset of the floodwall as part of FRMS works

Invasive non-native species clearance along the river bank and addition of varied ground flora within existing and extended woodland area. Shallow inlets from the swale and river bank re-wet the woodland. Seating provided where there are open views of the river. Bank reprofiling (subject to INNS)

Widen footpath enabling use for maintenance access

Thinning of the existing copse creates filtered views into the washlands. Extension of planting integrates new woodland space with natural play equipment

Ground lowering to create a swale and wetland habitats where ground becomes seasonally waterlogged. Potential for soil reuse in Burton FRMS to be explored

Potential architectural façade and entrance canopy improvements to Burton Library

Mown footpath connects users to the boardwalk and existing riverside desire line through the woodland, this route will be demarcated using edging to protect new ground flora

Enhanced public realm, including granite paving, new street furniture and lighting

Removal of fence and warning signage to expose manhole cover of unused groundwater extraction chamber

Accelerated management in Garden of Remembrance

Maintenance access over swale

Relay central path and upgrade lighting and street furniture

'Swan Around the Washlands' cycle route altered to remove section that currently loops through Garden of Remembrance

Retrofit balustrades to pedestrian footbridge to improve visual appearance

The addition of a central flagship play area to include natural and water play themes, creation of swales and addition of wildflower and grass planting encloses the play area
