Within the Corporate Plans for 2016/17 and 2017/18 there has been a commitment to appraise and investigate options for new methods of service delivery, including a review of the Council's Shopmobility service and to implement the findings of that review.  Following an extensive analysis of the service, the most appropriate direction was to source an external provider by competitive procurement or commissioning process, but to retain the physical assets for alternative use. A procurement exercise was undertaken and meetings held with interested parties but no bids were received. The extensive analysis suggested that if there was not an appropriate alternative provider willing to take on the service, the next step would be to consider closing the service. As a result, consultation on the closure of the service took place on 25/05/2017 to 15/06/2017.  All consultation responses were considered and feedback meetings held with the three staff involved. As no external provider has been procured it is recommended that the Shopmobility service be closed with effect from 21/07/2017. Crossley House itself will remain open for use by Mencap for the moment, and recommendations for the future use of the building will be made in due course.	No	No	24/07/2017
