Background / Context:

At the meeting of the Scrutiny (Community Regeneration, Environment and Health and Well Being) Committee held on 16th December 2020, Committee members agreed to undertake a review on recycling and that a sub-group made up of the councillors named above lead the review on behalf of the Committee.

The review will dovetail with the scrutiny review being undertaken the Scrutiny (Audit and Value for Money Council Services) Committee.

What are the core questions (no more than 3) the review is seeking to answer?

- 1. What are the key challenges to recycling?
- 2. What is the strategy to address these challenges?
- 3. How do other local authorities attempt to address community challenges to recycling

What is the purpose of the Review (in one sentence)?

To identify the Council's key challenges to recycling in the community and understand how other local authorities are addressing these challenges.

Scrutiny approach

Interview relevant officers from Waste Management to gain an understanding of the key challenges to recycling and our strategy to address them.

Undertake a survey with residents to understand their challenges to recycling.

Complete a benchmarking exercise with other local authorities to determine how they attempt to tackle these challenges.

As this review will dovetail with the Audit and Value for Money Council Services Scrutiny Committee, this committee's review will focus only on the elements above.
