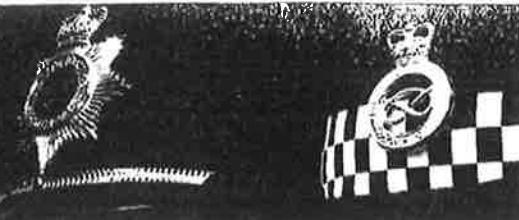

**Re Application to vary a Premises Licence – Locomotive Sports Bar, 28 Station  
Street, Burton on Trent, Staffordshire, DE14 1AU**

Staffordshire Police received an application to vary a premises licence on 11<sup>th</sup> January 2018, in relation to the above named premises, the purpose of this letter is to notify East Staffordshire Borough Council that the application is opposed by Staffordshire Police.

It is the Police's position that the granting of this variation would undermine the licensing objectives, namely, the Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety and Public Nuisance.

We have recently had interventions with the venue due to high incident levels. December saw a particular spike in incidents, a significant number of those were of a violent nature.

During December the venue submitted a number of temporary event notices to extend their hours, however, during the extended hours there were a number of incidents.

Due to this, together with the high incident levels Staffordshire Police feel that by extending the opening hours of the venue, this will further contribute to the violence during the night time economy, therefore it is our decision to object to this variation.
