During the evenings we have to keep our windows closed, to be able to hear our T.V.s. or enjoy a conversation with any visitors.

Ludgate street is very much a residential area. Many of the residents in Webb C. House are in their 80's, one lady is indeed 94. At this time of life - we should not have to put up with this situation. Had I been made aware of what kind of pub this is - i.e. rough, I would never had bought my property. I'm considering moving. This pub is giving Tutbury a bad name! Why do we need two pubs within 100 yards of each other? who wants to look out of their window to see men windowing up against the pub wall, ^{OR} into the garden of the next door House?
