# Former Burton pub landlord found in ladies' toilets after slamming door on woman's fingers

The 67-year-old inflicted a 'really nasty injury' on his victim

A former Burton pub landlord slammed a bedroom door on a woman's fingers in a heated row - then locked her upstairs and fell asleep in the ladies' toilets, a court has heard.

Cannock Magistrates' Court heard how Shaun Doyle inflicted a "really nasty injury" on his victim by **slamming the door** while her fingers were in the doorway.

She called police in the early hours when Doyle subsequently locked her upstairs in **Burton pub** The Navigation.

<u>Officers smashed</u> their way into the pub to find 67-year-old Doyle in the women's toilets, where he had reportedly dozed off.

Now Doyle, a former landlord of **Stapenhill pub** The Plough, has been ordered to pay £200 compensation to his victim after pleading guilty to assault.

He was also made the subject of a two-year community order.

Nick Wenden, defending, said: "There was an argument, he stormed off upstairs and she followed him.

"He says he didn't intend to injure her.

He appeared at Cannock Magistrates' Court

"Clearly the argument was ongoing and he decided to remove himself. He went downstairs.

"He says he didn't hear the police - the first thing he heard was when police came into the toilets and shone a light in his face.

"He didn't appreciate she [his victim] didn't have a key and he wasn't awake to open the door."

# WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU'RE CHARGED WITH A CRIME?

Mr Wenden said alcohol was "a factor" in the life of Doyle, who also used to run the Loaf and Cheese, in Waterloo Street, in Burton.

Mitigating, he said: "He struggles emotionally as he has no family locally and no outlet when things come to a head.

"He's currently subject to a community order [for another assault] from last year and is going well on that."

Magistrates made Doyle, of The Anchor, in New Street, Burton, the subject of a 12 month restraining order banning him from contacting the victim, as well as fines



They include a £50 fine, an £85 victim surcharge, £400 court costs and £200 compensation to the victim, whose injury magistrates described as "a really nasty injury which should not have happened".

The offence took place on October 20 last year.
