



Dear Sir/Madam

I am writing my representation against the application the Premises License Application for Shobnall Sports and Social Club based on the Licensing Objective:

## To Prevent Public Nuisance

I accept the business was established before Belway Homes built the estate (Bridgewater Rd) and I do not object to listening to "break out" of live and recorded music up to a point. Noise pollution is a proximity issue and our property is directly behind the sports and social club. We obviously knew this fact when we purchased and do not want to interfere with their business and want to encourage them to prosper and keep jobs in Burton-Upon-Trent.

My representation is based upon the new premises license application which seems to want to extend the licensable activity of entertainment into the next morning and increase the size of the premises.

- If the previous licence was 11pm, entertainment had definitely gone past this time which makes it unauthorised and an offence under the Licensing Act 2003
- If parts of the club have not been licensed but used for Licensable activities that again is unauthorised and an offence under the Licensing Act 2003.

I believe the correct decision is to exclude the licensable activity of entertainment post 11pm from the application. The application should be aligned to the original license granted for the Sports Club and this would

bring a mutually beneficial relationship between the regulatory authorities, the premises and local residents of Bridgwater Rd.

I wish the club all the best for the future however I do believe that granting the new license in its present format will **not** be promoting the licensing objectives of the Licensing Act 2003
