# 68/21 PROPOSAL TO SUSPENT IMPLEMENTATION OF EMISSIONS POLICY CONTAINED WITH THE HACKNEY CARRIAGE AND PRIVATE HIRE POLICY 2019 - 2022

Members were asked to consider a request from the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire trade in East Staffordshire to reconsider the Emissions Policy currently contained within the Taxi and Private Hire Policy 2019 – 2021.

The Policy states that "Any application for the grant of a renewal of a hackney carriage or private hire vehicle shall not be granted unless the vehicle complies with the current technology. As from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2022, all licensed hackney carriage vehicles and all private hire vehicles must be fitted with at least a Euro 4 compliant engine for vehicles fitted with a petrol engine, or at least a Euro compliant engine for vehicles fitted with a diesel engine".

The current Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Policy will shortly be the subject of formal consultation with the trade and the subject of a full report back to the Licensing Committee on any proposed amendments. The revised policy will require Full Council's approval.

The Hackney Carriage and Private Hire trade had asked for a delay and reconsideration to the implementation following the financial impact of COVID pandemic and information from other authorities regarding local implementation dates. Appendix 2 circulated with the Agenda showed other authorities vehicle policies.

There are currently 174 vehicles that will not comply by 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022, with 431 vehicles on the fleet.

Licensing authorities are being urged by Central Government to exercise discretion in dealings with the licensed taxi trade. Their guidance states that: "Licensing authorities should consider ways in which they can use their existing powers to support the trade to continue to operate and provide essential travel".

The report recommended two options: that the Council temporarily suspend the implementation of Paragraph 19 of the Council's Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing Policy 2019 – 2022, which deals with the implementation of the Emissions Policy, until the policy has been renewed, consulted upon and amended in 2022; or

That the Committee may decide not to suspend the implementation of the Emissions Policy.

## Resolved:

Members decided not to suspend the implementation of the Emissions policy.
