## 128/21 **CORPORATE PLAN PERFORMANCE REPORT 2020/21 END OF YEAR**

The report of the Head of Service (Sal Khan) on the update on progress at the end of the 2020/21 financial year towards achieving the “Community Regeneration” and “Environment and Health & Well Being” priorities set out in East Staffordshire Borough Council’s Corporate Plan was considered. The following appendices had been circulated with the report:

- Appendix 1: Contains comprehensive data on all Corporate Indicators;
- Appendix 2: Benchmarking.

Councillors noted that at the meeting held on 14<sup>th</sup> June 2021, Cabinet had resolved that those targets with an amber status should be considered red for the purposes of reporting the year end position, giving 88.3% green and 11.7% red overall.

The Committee noted that out of the total of 109 targets, 27 contributed to the “Community Regeneration” Corporate priority and of these 27 targets, 21 were green; 2 was amber; 1 were red status and 3 had been deferred. Of the 24 live targets, 87.50% were green; 8.33% were amber and 4.17% were red status. (As Cabinet had resolved that the targets with an Amber status should be considered red for the purposes of reporting the year end position, this would give 87.5% green and 12.5% red in the Community Regeneration priority). Out of the total 109 targets, 26 contributed to the “Environment and Health and Well Being” Corporate Priority and of these 26 targets, 21 were green, 1 was amber and 4 had been deferred. Of the 22 live targets for the “Environment and Health and Well Being” Corporate Priority 95.45% were green and 4.55% were amber. (As Cabinet had resolved that the targets with an amber status should be considered red for the purposes of reporting the year end position, this would give 95.45% green and 4.55% red in the Environment and Health & Wellbeing priority).

As such, officers have also liaised with Everyone Active regarding the ongoing use of Uttoxeter Leisure Centre and car park as a focal point for the Uttoxeter ParkRun, and Everyone Active have confirmed they are happy to support these events.
