Local Planning Authorities have a statutory duty to designate and amend conservation areas as and where appropriate under the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 (Section 69). The purpose of Conservation Areas are prescribed in the Act is to protect 'areas of special architectural or historic interest the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance'. The review of such areas is covered under Section 71. The Council has a statutory duty to consult on the conservation areas appraisals in accordance with Section 69 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, including boundary amendments for a period of six weeks. The boundary amendment consultation took place between October and November 2016. The Council received 3 representations in total for the proposed conservation boundary amendments.	No	No	20/06/2018
